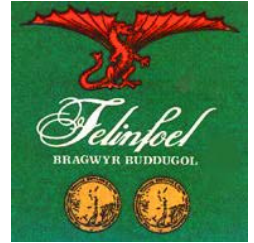
Felinfoel

The oldest brewery in Wales, Felinfoel is still family-owned, dating back to 1830. In the 1930s, this brewery was the first in Europe to put beer in cans.

Double Dragon (4.2%) * * * < - ENGLISH BEST BITTER - > – A sweetish, malty, amber ale.

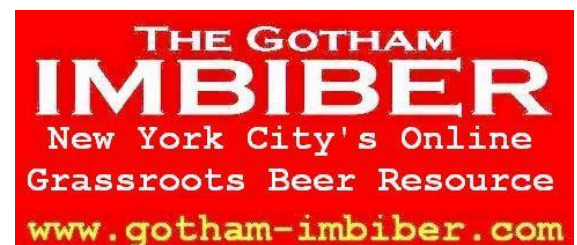
