Malheur 10 (10.0%) ***** < - BELGIAN GOLDEN STRONG ALE - > – Full bodied golden ale with a rich, honey-like texture, and a slightly hoppy finish.

Malheur Bière Brut (aka Brut Reserve) (11.0%) ***** < - BIÈRE DE CHAMPAGNE / BIÈRE BRUT - > – A highly-carbonated golden champagne-style beer. Drink out of a flute for maximum effect.

Malheur 12 (12.0%) ***** < - BELGIAN BARLEYWINE / QUAD - > – Dark brown, complex with notes of fruit and chocolate.

Malheur Black Chocolate (aka Dark Brut) {S} (12.0%) ***** < - BIÈRE DE CHAMPAGNE / BIÈRE BRUT - > – Unique dark champagne-style beer. Drink out of a flute for maximum effect.
