Although the company was formed in the late 19th century, only soft drinks and low alcohol 'hop bitters' were made until a change of direction in 1978 which saw cask ale brewing commence. Many awards have been won, including Supreme Champion Beer of Britain in 2000 for the cask-conditioned version of Black Cat.

{S} after the beer name denotes seasonal availability.

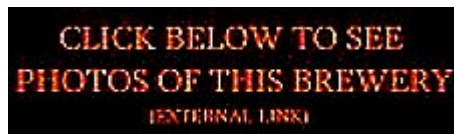
Black Cat (3.4%) ***** < - ENGLISH DARK MILD - > – Authentic British Dark Mild Ale. Dark and refreshing with a distinct chocolate malt flavor and a smooth, balanced finish.

Pendle Witches Brew (5.1%) ***** < - EXTRA SPECIAL BITTER (ESB) - > – Full-flavored, amber colored ale that has a slightly sweet, nutty taste and a subtle, fruity hoppiness.

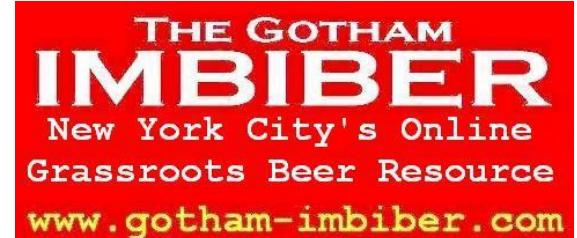
